Program structure

Participants undertake Units of Competency including Occupational Health and Safety, measurements and calculations, handling construction materials, basic hand skills and reading and interpreting plans.

CPCCWHS1001 Prepare to work safely in the construction industry (white card). Unit of competency forms part of this course.

There is an emphasis on the practical aspects of building and construction that provides participants with the opportunity to participate in basic construction projects.

Mode of delivery

Training is delivered face-to-face at our Forrestfield and Joondalup locations. Training will be delivered with a mix of theory-based and practical workshop-based learning.

Training is held between 9:00am - 3:00pm.

Program duration

Joondalup training runs for 13 weeks, Tuesday - Thursday full time.

Forrestfield training runs for 12 weeks, Monday - Thursday full time.

Participant resources

To participate in the CPC20112 Certificate II in Construction, participants must wear:

- Steel cap boots
- Appropriate work shirts (long or short sleeved) and pants/shorts

Participants are to supply the above and must also remember to bring a notebook and pen to training.

Program requirements

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY: Participants must be an Australian citizen or Permanent resident and have full work rights to enrol on the course. Students must be at least 15 years of age.

Program commitment

To be awarded the CPC20211 Certificate II in Construction Pathways, participants must attend all training days and must successfully complete all units of competency. Poor attendance may result in being withdrawn from the program.
